Madelia City Council certifies election results, renews business licenses

The Madelia City Council held a workshop and meeting on Novem-

During the workshop, the budget for the police department and the fire department were reviewed. There was discussion about inflation and how that will affect all the city budgets. Current balances as of October 31 of all the loan funds that the city currently has were provided to the Council by Madelia City Administrator Chris Fischer.

In the regular meeting, the results of the 2022 general election were certified. Cody Eager was elected to the Madelia City Council (mayor position) for the term of four years. Mark Slater was elected to the Madelia City Council (councilman position) for the term of four years. Glen Christensen was elected to the Madelia City Council (councilman position) for the term of four years. Phyllis Schickling was elected to the Madelia City Council (councilman position) for the term of two years.

The council approved splitting parcel 17 .277.0010. Gary Anderson's property at 418 Second Street NE was sold to Madelia Health. This is the new location for two of the hospital houses that need to be moved. This parcel needs to be split into the follow-

1. Lot 18, Farnsworth's 2nd Addition

2. Lot 17, Farnsworth's 2nd Addition

Due to splitting the lot, a new address needs to be assigned to Lot 18 as 414 Second Street NE. The address of Lot 18, Farnsworth 2nd Addition was established as 414 Second Street NE.

These lots will be 8,760 square feet each. Although City Zoning Ordinance 153 says that each building erected shall be located on a lot having an area of not less than 10,000 square feet and width of not less than 80 feet and depth of not less than 120 feet, these lots were platted and recorded prior to the passage of the ordinance and therefore buildings are approved to be

put on these lots. Josh Schoener from Madelia Health assured the Council that the homes being put on the lots will fit without needing any variances of current set back ordinances.

The Council approved the following 2023 business licenses:

Theater: Madelia Theater-CCC Cigarette licenses: American Legion, Dollar General, Sunshine Foods, Casey's and Staples/Hol-

Liquor licenses: American Legion-club license; Madelia Lanes -wine/strong beer license; Plaza F!esta-full license; Lost Sanity Brewing-brewery license; and Evoke Winery-full license.

Also approved was advertising for 2023 open commission seats: Light Plant – two seats; Golf Commission - one seat; and Park Board Commission – one seat.

The Council approved Mark Skarpohl Agency's submission for the city's insurance agent request for proposals.

The Council went into closed session for conferring with legal counsel.
